Getting There

You may already have ideas on when you want to arrive and leave as well as other arrangements you want to do while you are in Europe. We work with multiple airlines and suppliers and our travel specialists can customise a total travel package for you giving you inspiring travel options.

We are not holding group flights, but we can quote on best travel solution that suits your needs.

Transport options from Malaga airport have not been included in this package.

Options will be sourced later once HOT Events/Tri Travel has an indication of the number of people travelling and what is required. Costs will be payable separately.

How long does my passport need to be valid for?

Everyone travelling to Spain will require a valid passport. If you are not travelling on a New Zealand passport please advise us immediately as different requirements may apply. For a visit to Spain your passport needs to be valid for at least 3 months past the date of stay. If you do need to renew your passport please do this as soon as possible via http://www.passports.govt.nz/

If you are travelling to another country as part of this travel, then different passport validities may apply, with some countries requiring your passport to be valid for at least 6 months beyond the expected date of your departure from that country.

A visa is not required for New Zealand Passport holders but like other countries in Europe, you can only stay for holiday purposes for a period of less than 90 days and will likely be asked for proof of return flights out of Europe. If you have a criminal conviction specific regulations will apply.

How do I travel with my CO2 Canisters?

Generally, up to 2 CO2 canisters are permitted when carried in your checked luggage. Please check with the airline you are booked with to clarify. They will not be permitted as carry-on luggage.

Bike damaged from your flight?

Please report to the airlines luggage desk and fill out the relevant paperwork. Please also follow the advice from your insurance company if you bike sustains any damage during the flight or by the airline.

Do I need any vaccinations?

No vaccinations are required, but if you have any concerns, we recommend contacting your GP. Proof of Covid-19 vaccination is not required when travelling to Spain

What is the best way to get around?

The easiest way to get around Malaga is using public transport; bus, train or walking. The city is ideally sized for walking, and nearly all of the items of historical/artistic interest are within easy walking distance of the city centre, right in front of the Capilla de la Peregrina. The easiest form of travel to use is the metro as there is only two lines. The main train station is called Estación de Málaga Maria Zambrano. The trains run every 6-10minutes in weekdays and is reasonably priced. C1 is an important line to remember as this goes to the airport. Bussing is another popular form of transport. The main station, Paseo de los Tilos is a 15minute walk from the city centre. Malaga Bici is a bike rental company if you would like to explore the city through the streets. The first 30mins is free than the company charges -€1.02 per hour. Taxis are easy to get but are expensive hence bus, train or uber is recommended. To explore further afield a rental car can be arranged.

What is the time difference between New Zealand and Malaga, Spain?

Spain is on Central European Time (GMT +1 hour) and is <u>currently</u> 12 hours behind New Zealand during NZ Daylight Savings Time (or 10 hours during Spanish Daylight Savings Time).

What will the weather be like?

During October, the temperature in Malaga ranges from 14C - 24C degrees. During the day it is expected to be around 20C and at most 24C. Some describe it as mildly cool with a gentle breeze. On average the rainfall tends to be light however thunderstorms can be common in October which includes heavy rain. The sun tends to rise at approximately 8:30am and sets at approximately 7:30pm.

What time is check in and out of the hotel?

Check in is from 2pm and you do need to vacate your rooms by 12pm.

Please note that due to hotel policy, they will require photo identification on check in (passport) and credit card provided to cover any incidentals during your stay if not paid for at the time of check out.

Can I get ice at the property?

Please see reception or room service for ice delivery.

What are the hotel facilities like?

The hotel has:

- Restaurant & snack bar
- Swimming pool (indoor & outdoor)
- Public Parking offsite (charge applies)
- Spa/wellness centre, sauna, gym
- TV, safe deposit box, hairdryer

NOTE: Tea/coffee facilities and mini-fridges are not provided in the rooms at this hotel.

If this is important to you we suggest you take your own portable jug and keep-cup to make tea/coffee We will ask the hotel is there is a work around for the fridge, it may end up being a communal option.

Can I take my phone charger or hair straighteners?

In Spain the power sockets are of type F, which is two round prongs. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz. You will need a power plug adapter, however you can use your electric appliances in Spain, because the standard voltage (230 V) is the same as in New Zealand.

To be sure, check the label on the appliance. Some appliances never need a converter. If the label states 'INPUT: 100-240V, 50/60 Hz' the appliance can be used in all countries in the world. This is common for chargers of tablets/laptops, photo cameras, cell phones, toothbrushes, etc.

Are taxes included in prices?

A Value Added Tax (VAT) of 21% is included in the cost of most purchased goods and services.

Is there a tax refund schemes?

As a tourist in Spain, you may be able to claim back the taxes on certain purchases. To find out more visit https://www.spain.info/en US/informacion-practica/consejos-viaje/consejos-practicos/dinero/ HOT Events' tip is to get the app and complete the paperwork on this to save time at the airport

Spain does not have a big tipping culture. Waiters, guides and hotel staff get a basic salary and in general tips are included in prices so tips and gratuities are not generally expected. However, if you are happy with the service and the attention you were given, then a small tip is often greatly appreciated.

What do I do about money?

The currency in Spain is the Euro, the same as in other European Union countries. NZ\$1 is approx. EURO.57c You can pay with international cards many places in Spain and always at hotels. It is best that you have a pin on your credit card otherwise some shops and restaurants may not except payment from your card. Banking hours are Mon to Fri 8.30am - 2.00pm. However ATMs are available around the clock.

Remember to inform your credit card's issuing bank about your intended trip or else you will risk getting your credit card accounts frozen from 'un-expected activity'.

For the latest exchange rates check out www.xe.com. We do recommend that you exchange money at the airport prior to departing, thus ensuring you have cash upon arrival. ATM machines are also readily available throughout Spain.

What are the opening hours of shops?

The most usual business hours are Mon-Sat from 9.30am - 1.30pm and 4.30pm-8pm.

What are the prices of general items?

How much Duty Free can I take in and out of New Zealand?

We recommend that you pre order for collection on the way home your Duty Free:

When returning to New Zealand your allowance is:

- 50 cigarettes or 50g of tobacco or 50 cigars
- No more than 3 bottles of spirits (up to a maximum of 1125ml each)
- 4.5 litres of wine, port, sherry, champagne (six bottles) or beer (12 cans)
- Goods to the value of NZ\$700 purchased Duty Free or overseas

Heading into Spain

- 200 cigarettes or 250g of tobacco or 50 cigars
- 4 litres of wine and 1 litre of liquor or 16 litres of beer
- Goods to the value of EUR430.00 air & sea travellers and EUR300 for other travellers

What is the drinking age?

It is illegal to "sell, serve, or offer" any form of distilled alcohol to those under the age of 18 or any alcoholic drink to those under **16**. Fermented drinks like beer or wine are permitted above **16**. Consuming alcohol in public (streets, parks, beaches) is prohibited and fines apply for those who are caught.

Can I use my phone in Spain?

Spain's country code is +34 and the area code is 93. All the Spanish mobile-phone companies (Telefónica's MoviStar, Orange and Vodafone) offer *prepagado* (prepaid) accounts for mobiles. The SIM card costs from €10, to which you add some prepaid phone time. Phone outlets are scattered throughout the country.

Wi-fi is almost universally available at hotels, as well as in some cafes, restaurants and airports; generally (but not always) it's free. Some tourist offices may have a list of wi-fi hot spots in their area.

Using your mobile phone overseas depends on your phone type, plan and provider; please check with your provider prior to travel that it is set up for roaming. Costs do depend on your provider and the supplier in Spain, so visit the provider's website for a guideline on costs. HOT Events recommends that if your iPhone or android phone is automatically syncing online, to turn this off prior to departing New Zealand or you will come home to a shocking bill!

Tips to help with your Travel

Studies show ginger root may reduce motion sickness. Avoid eating a heavy meal for at least two hours before travelling and refrain from eating acidic foods.

The air that you breathe on the plane is drier than normal, so it will increase your risk of dehydration. Drink at least 200ml of water for every hour you are in the air.

Keeping yourself hydrated also reduces the risk of deep vein thrombosis (DVT). Eat oily fish or take an Omega-3 fatty acid supplement for several weeks before travelling.

HOT Events also recommends purchasing a pair of flight compression socks from your local pharmacy if you are a regular traveller. Travelling in your compression tights (eg Skins) is a great option for comfort and recovery

On the ground

Water is safe to drink in Spain. The Spanish drink bottled water only for its taste. If travelling in remote areas, it is best to play it safe and drink bottled water.

How do I keep safe?

Like any destination there is always a risk of petty crime so keep your wits about you and your valuables in sight. We recommend safely and securely storing three important travel documents (your passport, credit card and driver's license) on your phone. Use an app such as Traveler ID which will store a series of documents in one place. Of course, you might lose your phone, so also store them in the Cloud, or your saved emails. We recommend you be street wise. Crime is uncommon, but take the same precautions you would in any urban area. We recommend that all travellers overseas register their travel with MFAT on www.safetravel.govt.nz
